

## When Giants Come to Play

Giant Tea Party	<ul> <li>Small Dixie cups or little medicine cups</li> <li>Tiny paper plates</li> <li>Iced tea, lemonade or water</li> <li>Mini-M&amp;Ms and other small candies</li> <li>Mini-cupcakes or small round cookies</li> <li>Canned frosting</li> <li>Plastic knives</li> <li>Sprinkles</li> <li>LOTS of paper towels!</li> </ul>	Students decorate their own "cakes" and have a tea party in which they are the giants.
Be a Giant!	<ul> <li>Giant roll of butcher paper or paper from newspaper press (end rolls can often be purchased from local presses for very little).</li> <li>Art supplies</li> <li>Photos of student's family members.</li> <li>Glue.</li> </ul>	Draw an outline of each student on the paper and cut out. Students should decorate as themselves and include a shirt pocket in the design. Place pictures of family members peeking out of pocket as Anna peeks from the giant's pockets.
Where's the Bean?	A dried bean or some other small item.	Choose a student to be "it." The class leaves the room or cover their eyes while the student hides the bean where it can be seen by the class in their seats. When class returns or uncovers their eyes, they must find the bean without leaving their seats. Variation 1: Students roam to find the bean. Variation 2: One student leaves the room. One student hides the bean. The entire class helps the student find the bean with directions ( <i>warmer or colder</i> ).

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
