Giant Tea Party	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Small Dixie cups or little medicine cups• Tiny paper plates• Iced tea, lemonade or water• Mini-M&Ms and other small candies• Mini-cupcakes or small round cookies• Canned frosting• Plastic knives• Sprinkles• LOTS of paper towels!	Students decorate their own “cakes” and have a tea party in which they are the giants.
Be a Giant!	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Giant roll of butcher paper or paper from newspaper press (end rolls can often be purchased from local presses for very little).• Art supplies• Photos of student’s family members.• Glue.	<p>Draw an outline of each student on the paper and cut out. Students should decorate as themselves and include a shirt pocket in the design.</p> <p>Place pictures of family members peeking out of pocket as Anna peeks from the giant’s pockets.</p>
Where’s the Bean?	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• A dried bean or some other small item.	<p>Choose a student to be “it.”</p> <p>The class leaves the room or cover their eyes while the student hides the bean where it can be seen by the class in their seats.</p> <p>When class returns or uncovers their eyes, they must find the bean without leaving their seats.</p> <p>Variation 1: Students roam to find the bean.</p> <p>Variation 2: One student leaves the room. One student hides the bean. The entire class helps the student find the bean with directions (<i>warmer or colder</i>).</p>
